WCSPC ANNOUNCEMENTS

The WCSPC is excited to announce that we now have ONEboxes to distribute to our community!

We'd like to give a special thanks to Wilson County Government, as the strategic distribution of ONEBox is fully funded and supported via Wilson County's Opioid Action Plan. The WCSPC will also be working alongside the Wilson County Health Department and Wilson County Emergency Medical Services around the disbursement of ONEbox within our community.

The ONEbox is an emergency opioid overdose reversal kit designed to promote safety by assuring that individuals have life-saving, on-demand training when and where they need it.

Upon opening the ONEbox, it goes into a 60-second video talking through how to administer Naloxone in an emergency opioid overdose or poisoning situation. The ONEbox can also train any number of individuals on naloxone administration in about 5 minutes when using the training mode. Inside the ONEbox, you will also find a PPE kit (mask, gloves, & wipes) and Naloxone!
