We are excited to get our Mental Health First Aid Trainings (Adult & Youth) back up and running! We have trainer (s) from Trillium coming to RC3 to facilitate them! The classes will be in person from 8:30am-1:30pm, but a 2 hour self-pace study (online) will be completed before the in person session. After completion, attendees will receive a certification from the National Council For Mental Wellbeing.

The Mental Health First Aid courses teach how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders. The trainings gives you the skills you need to reach out and provide initial help and support to someone who may be developing a mental health or substance use problem or experiencing a crisis. The Adult MHFA will focus on helping adults and the Youth MHFA will focus on helping youth!

PARTNER PORTION

On February 1, 2024, Trillium Health Resources, Eastpointe, and Sandhills Center merged to provide managed care services for serious behavioral health, intellectual/developmental disabilities, and traumatic brain injury. There is a total of 46 counties in the combined region, with a total population of 3,094,863.

Throughout this process, their priority is protecting care continuity by honoring all provider contracts (for those in good standing and serving members in affected counties). It is important that members remain with their current provider or care manager. Since last year, they have confirmed that more than 1,200 providers (new or current) will have contracts with Trillium for the 18 additional counties. Beneficiaries and recipients do not need to do anything about the LME/MCO changes. Everyone will keep getting services as they did before the merge.

ABOUT TRILLIUM HEALTH RESOURCES

Trillium Health Resources is an innovative health plan for individuals with serious behavioral health, intellectual/developmental disabilities, and traumatic brain injury in 46 counties in North Carolina. Through contracts with NCDHHS, we serve Medicaid members on NC Medicaid Direct, state-funded recipients who are uninsured, and members on the Innovations Waiver.
