The Wilson County Substance Prevention Coalition was established in April 2007. The coalition is organized for the charitable purpose of reducing substance misuse by addressing factors in the community that increases the risk of substance misuse and promoting the factors that minimize that risk.

Recovery Concepts Community Center (RC3) is a community recovery center and an initiative of The Wilson County Substance Prevention Coalition, created in 2017. This community center is for those working to sustain and maintain their recovery from substance use disorders can visit the center to take part in educational opportunities, group meetings, social events, or just to hang out in a place that is recovery informed, friendly, and healthy.

My job with the WCSPC will be assisting in the community outreach efforts and coordination within the target rural service areas, focusing particularly on Wilson and to come at a later date Edgecombe, Nash, Wayne, and Warren counties. This will also provide direct support and assist in care coordination for individuals seeking substance use treatment including assisting community members to enroll in health insurance. My job will also include the continuation of testing services for HIV, hepatitis, syphilis, gonorrhea, and chlamydia in our community.

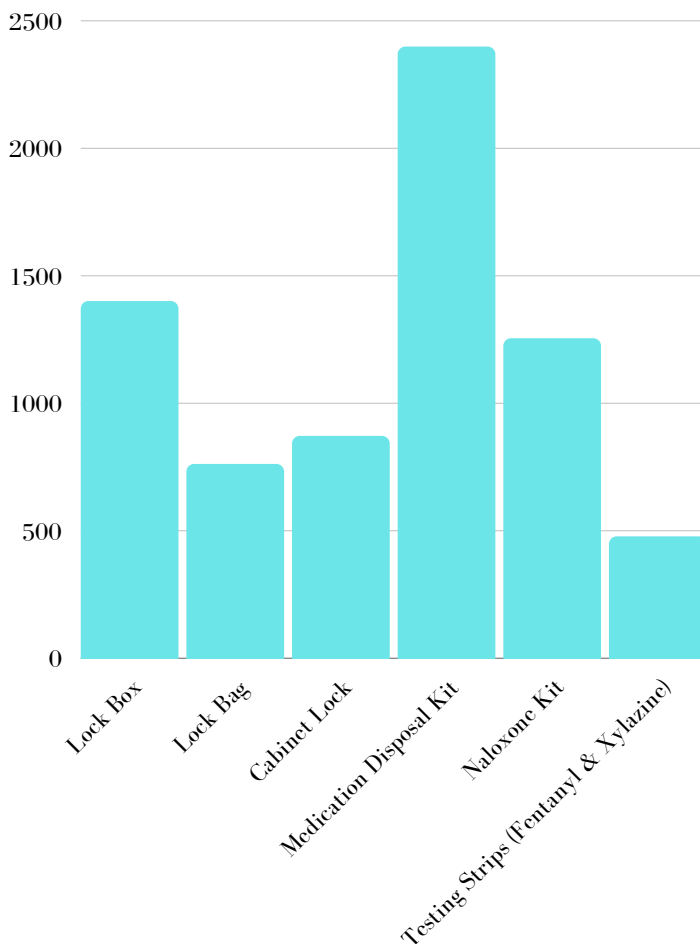

DATA VISUALIZATION

The WCSPC provides many free prevention resources to Wilson County residents. This includes medication lock boxes and bags, cabinet/refrigerator locks, medication disposal kits, and Naloxone kits, and testing strips (Fentanyl & Xylazine). Throughout 2024, the WCSPC gave out 7,167 resources that are actively being used in our community!
