This community center is for those working to sustain and maintain their recovery from substance use disorders can visit the center to take part in educational opportunities, group meetings, social events, or just to hang out in a place that is recovery informed, friendly, and healthy.



The Wilson County Substance Prevention Coalition provides the Wilson County community with free Lock Your Meds materials to keep medications and alcohol from getting into the wrong hands. The materials include medication locking boxes, medication/vaping material locking bags, cabinet/refrigerator locks, and medication disposal kits. Anyone who needs these materials are always welcome to stop by the office or give us a call and let us know what they need!

The chart below shows the amount of materials given away in 2021 and 2022. In 2021 the total number of materials given was 5,113 and in 2022 the number was 6,697 items!

PARTNER PORTION

The people who make Wilson Fire/Rescue Services work, from personnel to leadership, are of the highest quality. Various people in our organization including staff, emergency operations, training, maintenance, public education, or community risk reduction have all dedicated themselves to the life safety of the citizens of Wilson. Every individual has been selected specifically for the role they serve, and have committed themselves to being an important part of the team.

The Operations Division is 90 members dedicated to public service. These men and women operate from 5 strategically located stations to serve the community with an all hazards response. The men and women in the Operations Division are highly trained and customer service focused.

The Community Risk Reduction Division, also serves to educate the citizens in all aspects of fire and life safety. Along with a comprehensive list of education objectives, fire inspectors provide a number of other inspection services including tent, blasting, daycare, foster care, fireworks usage, hazardous materials inventory, underground tank removal, and other types of courtesy inspections.

The training division is responsible for providing both basic and advance level continuing education training to all members of the organization. This training includes Firefighter, EMT, Technical Rescue, Driver Operator, Officer Development, Fire Investigations and Hazardous Materials. There are three Safety/Training Officers that are assigned to each shift to assist with maintaining the training needs of the department and they operate as Safety Officers on emergency incidents. This division includes Hiring and Recruiting and Maintenance.

Some our Community Outreach services include but aren't limited too, installation of smoke alarms, Car seat installation, fire extinguisher training, Station tours, fire truck displays, CPR training, senior fire and falls workshop and general fire speaker.

We embrace the challenges and opportunities of providing these services in a fast-pace and complex environment. Through training, innovation, and a data-driven decision-making lens, we are able to remain in a constant state of improvement. We will continue to mold and shape our services to meet the ever-changing needs of this community. We will also continue to seek more effective and efficient means of delivering our services.
